- **Rep. Leonard Lance (R-NJ)** will be honored with the Public Policy Award for Research for his commitment to health care issues notably his work with the Recalcitrant Cancer Act late last year.
- **Rep. Debbie Wasserman Schultz (D-FL)**, a breast cancer survivor, will be awarded the Public Policy Award for Leadership in recognition of her work with the Education and Awareness Requires Learning Young (EARLY) Act, a directive to create a national education campaign about breast cancer for young adults and high-risk groups.
