These Terms and Conditions (“Terms”) for Cancer Support Community (“CSC”) apply to any person, guest, registrant, student, speaker, or exhibitor (“Attendee”) who is present at the 2025 Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) Summit (“Event”). By attending Event, the Attendee will be deemed to have accepted these Terms for CSC.

Modification of Program

CSC reserves the right, in their sole discretion, to make any changes to the program. Every effort will be made to keep presentations and speakers as represented. However, unforeseen circumstances may result in the substitution of one or more presentation topic(s) or speaker(s). CSC is not liable for changes in program date, content, speakers, or venue.

Cancellation of the Event

CSC may cancel Event due to circumstances beyond its control, including but not limited to, an act of God, government order, disaster, pandemic, or any other emergencies or circumstances which make it illegal, impractical, inadvisable, or impossible for CSC, the Event venue, or other locations of Event to provide the facilities and/or services for Event. Attendee registration may be cancelled for any one or more of such reasons by emailed notice from CSC to the Attendee without liability on the part of CSC. In the event of such cancellation, CSC will not be held liable to attendees for any damages, losses or costs incurred, including but not limited to transportation and accommodation costs.

Speakers, Presenters, and Vendors

CSC endeavors to have speakers, presenters, and vendors knowledgeable in their subject areas. Views expressed and materials distributed by speakers, presenters, and vendors during Event are solely those of the speakers and not of CSC. CSC disclaims any and all liability arising out of Attendees’ reliance on any speaker’s or presenter’s statements or materials.

Photography & Filming of Attendees

Photography, audio, and video recording may take place during Event. Attendees hereby grant CSC and their licensees, affiliates, employees, and representatives permission to record them at the Event, and distribute and publish (both now and in the future) the Attendee’s name, image, or voice in video and/or audio recordings, broadcast, rebroadcast, and electronic reproductions. Attendees consent to and authorize, in advance, such use and waive any rights of privacy and/or publicity they may have in connection therewith.



CSC appreciates all coverage of Event. Photography, audio recordings, and video recordings are permitted for personal, non-commercial use. Prior written consent of CSC is required for all other uses.

Accessibility Services

CSC is committed to conducting Event in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and to making all reasonable arrangements that will allow participation in Event. CSC will provide Attendee access to the Event. Attendee is solely responsible for obtaining and maintaining, at Attendee's own expense, all equipment needed to access the Event, including but not limited to Internet access and adequate bandwidth.

USE OF OR CONNECTION TO THE INTERNET PROVIDES THE OPPORTUNITY FOR UNAUTHORIZED THIRD PARTIES TO CIRCUMVENT SECURITY PRECAUTIONS AND ILLEGALLY GAIN ACCESS TO THE EVENT AND CUSTOMER DATA. Events Code of Conduct
Last Updated 8/29/2024

All attendees, speakers, sponsors, vendors, partners, Cancer Support Community (“CSC”) staff, CSC interns, and volunteers (“Participants”) at CSC events are required to adhere to the following Code of Conduct. Event Organizers will enforce this Code throughout the event. This policy applies to all CSC events held on public or private platforms.

Prior to an event, all Participants are expected to be familiar with this policy.

Participants who join or register for a CSC event constitute consent to audio and visual recording (and use and alteration of the recording) by CSC.

Our aim in hosting a CSC event is to build and connect with our community. We desire to create an environment where everyone feels welcome to participate, speak up, ask questions, and engage in conversation. This requires a harassment-free and inclusive environment that recognizes the inherent worth of every Participant. We invite all those who participate to help us create a safe and positive experiences for everyone.

We are dedicated to providing a harassment-free environment for all Participants, regardless of gender, gender identity and expression, age, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, ethnicity, or religion (or lack thereof). We do not tolerate harassment of Participants in any form. Sexual language and imagery, except when used in the context of medical terminology, are not appropriate during any aspect of this event, including talks, workshops, parties, social media posts or live streams, or other online media.

Developing and enforcing a Code of Conduct allows CSC to create the best and safest experience possible for all Participants.

Expected behaviors during CSC events:

- Exercise consideration and respect in your speech and actions.
- Refrain from demeaning, discriminatory, and/or harassing behavior and speech.
- During the event, no Participant should engage in harassment in any form.
- Do not disrupt the meeting (e.g., “photo-bombing”) or engage in harm or threats of harm of any kind. Do not create/contribute to a safety threat, unsafe, or exclusionary situation.



- Do not take or distribute pictures of or copy research posters/presentation materials unless explicit permission is granted. All event materials are shared with Participants for internal use only.

Violation of these rules is grounds for any action that CSC deems appropriate, including but not limited to expelling the Participant from the event without refund, if there was a cost, and prohibiting them from attending future events. All determinations are at the sole discretion of CSC, and the decision of the Event Organizer will be final. Participants asked to stop any harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately.

Differences of Opinion and Offense

It is not a violation of the Conduct Policy to express an opinion, raise research, or describe an experience (“articulation”) that is at odds with the opinions of or is offensive to others—if the articulation is part of an on-point discussion of the topic at hand and is offered in a manner that does not interfere with others’ reasonable ability and welcome to participate fully. That means expressing differing positions with respect and consideration for all, in a manner that reflects intellectual rigor and is demonstrably mindful of minimizing, as reasonably possible, its potential adverse effect on others’ ability to participate. (Offering an advance warning of the potential for impact on others is one way to demonstrate such respect and consideration for all.) It also means not making an articulation that is reasonably expected to cause offense gratuitously (i.e., unrelated or unnecessary for the work on that topic). It means not directing the articulation as a personal attack or put-down of an individual, and not dominating the discussion. It further means demonstrating consideration for anyone who appears to be in distress by promptly stopping the cause and demonstrating caring, while still pursuing a way to share pertinent information if needed.
